Photographers across the U.S. are taking images of families (posing on their front porches/steps) from about 10-20 feet away. Students can document a lot while abiding by social distancing orders.

Take a portrait of your family, neighbors, friend(s), pets. Combine it with how the subject(s) pictured are coping with the odd start to this school year, possibly sharing and finding stories about our “new normal.”

This activity adds an interview aspect to your photography and gets you thinking about story ideas for this year's book—great way to slightly introduce interviewing/interviewing at a distance. I would suggest you submit one to three photos and possible 50 to 100 words describing your subject and you and the ways you and your family are coping with the start of the year.

You can upload your photos to your OD account and identify the folder as Front Porch Family Portraits. Based on your adviser, you may copy your photos on this assignment sheet.
