Online Design's Photos area offers you the ability to create photo albums, which provides the structure to keep your yearbook images organized as the year progresses.

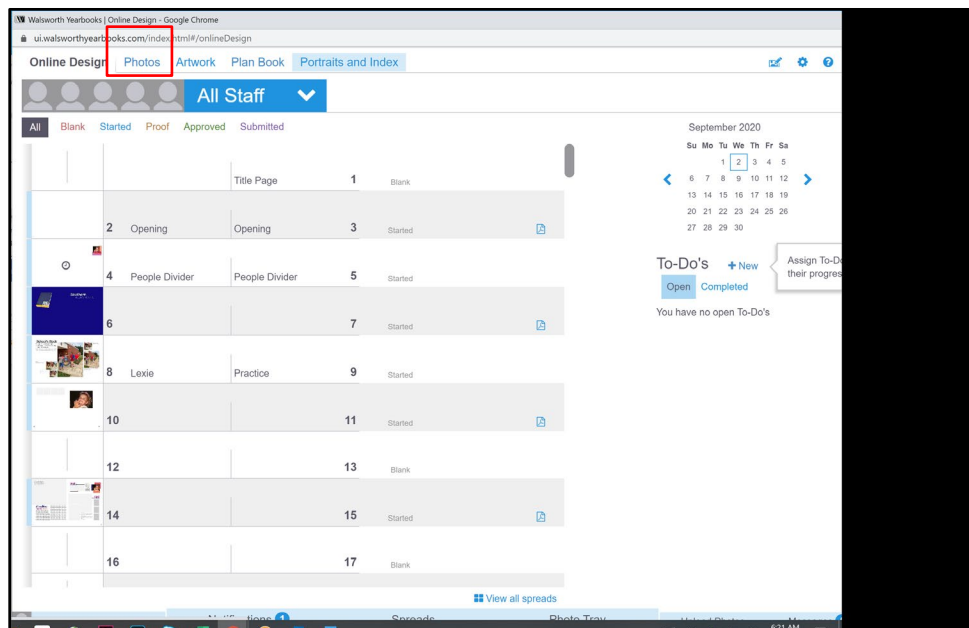
You have the ability to name your photo albums whatever you want, in a way that makes sense for the workflow of your yearbook staff – by date, by event, by section. It is up to you.

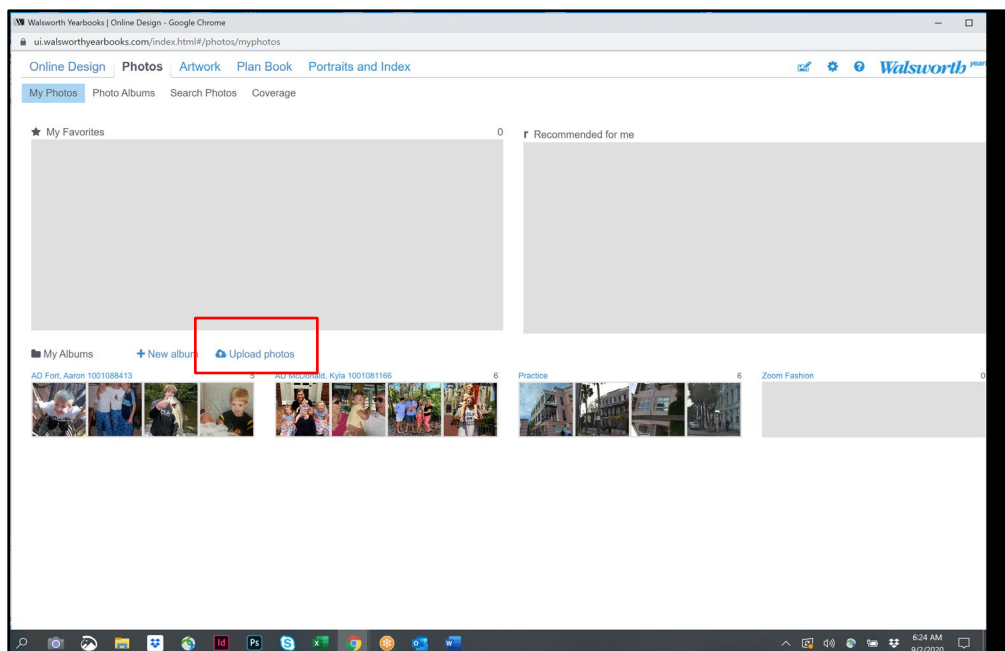
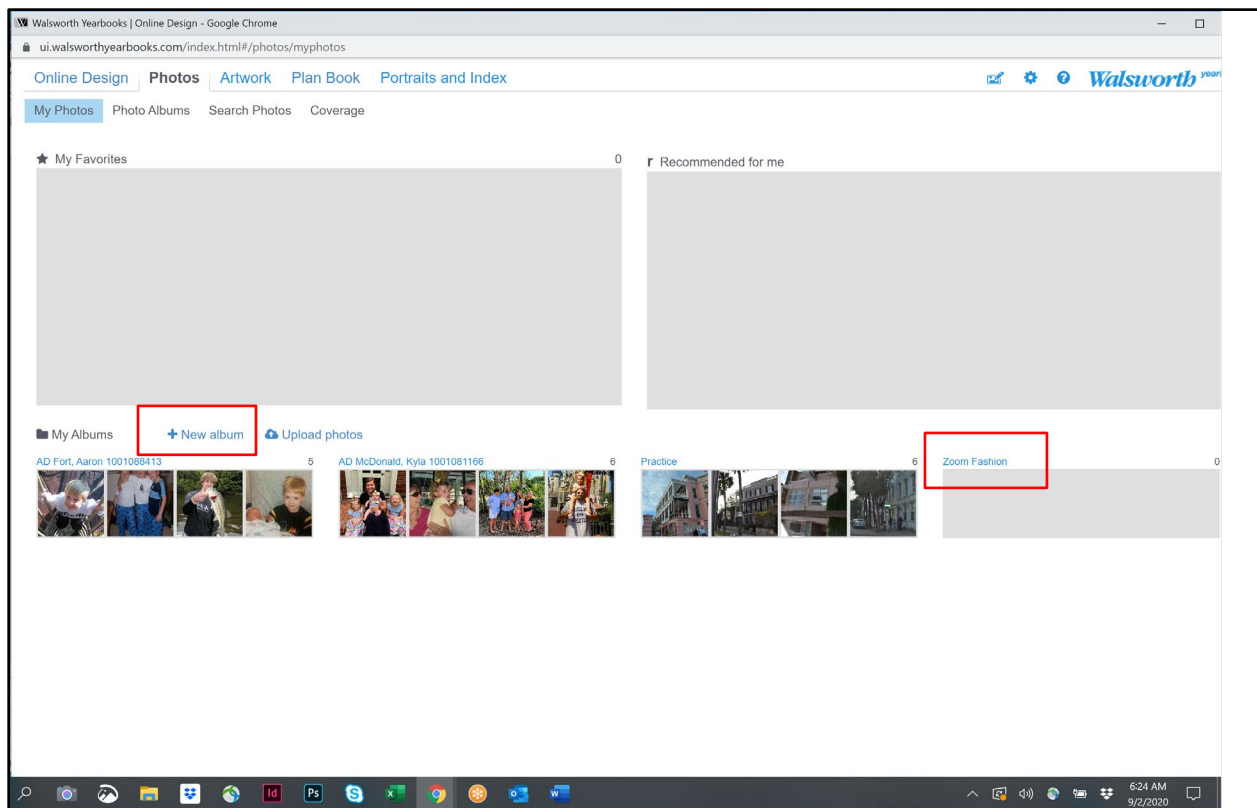
To create a photo album:

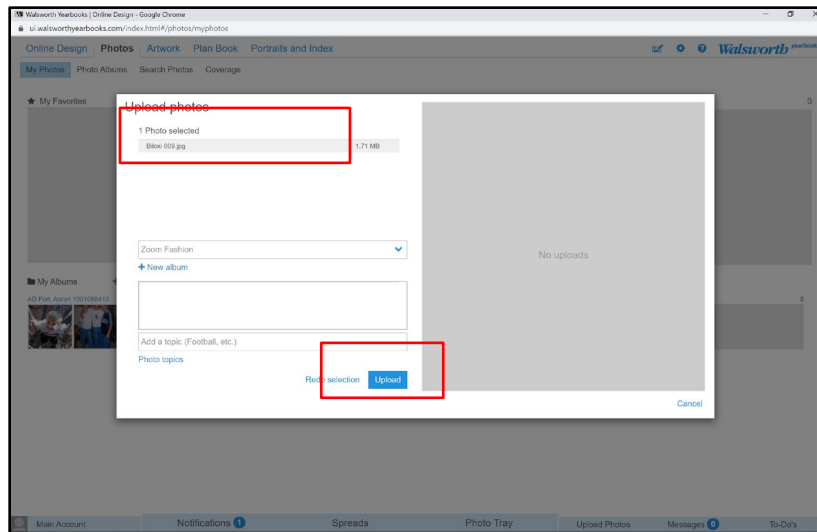
1. Once logged in to Online Design, click **Photos** in the main navigation.
2. Click **+New Album**.
3. Enter a name for the photo album in the text field. Click **Save**.

Once a photo album has been created, it can be renamed at any time. Simply click on an album's name to open it, then click the **Rename** button and type a new name in the field provided.

Part 1, Step 1 Assignment: **Two things to do to complete this assignment.**

1. Take 10 to 15 photos of your fashion style or someone at home during this zoom time. Try to take photos using at least four of the following photography techniques. Also, please remember some of the suggestion when using a smartphone.

Some Common Techniques: (Reminders from Mod 3)

- Action/Reaction- Somebody is doing something in the photo; Reaction- the subject responding to something, to the event
- Angle-Bird's eye View or Worm's eye view, Straight forward
- Anticipate the moment- think about what is going to occur- keep taking photos
- Closeness Closeness-move in close -closeness makes you feel like you know that person or persons
- Framing-us trees, architecture, to frame your image
- Leading lines- in the environment; they lead you to the center of attention

- Lighting-Look for the unusual- a new look or perspective on something is loved by all
- Repetition a series of objects or people doing the same thing or activity
- Rule of thirds-cropping-Action is on one of the intersection points

Cellphone-ography Reminders: (Reminders from Mod 3)

- Clean the Lens
 - Hold Camera with Two Hands
 - Shoot from a Low Angle
 - Shoot More Horizontal Photos
 - Do NOT use the Flash
 - Do NOT use the Zoom
 - Take Silhouette Photos
 - Keep Shooting
 - Use Gridlines
 - Know Phone Settings
 - Set Resolutions High
