Cheerleaders, Band, Choir and First Day of School are not headlines. We will look at three ways to write creative headlines.

Puns: Make a joke exploiting the different possible meanings of a word. Play off words that sound alike but have different meanings.

Rhyme: Correspondence of sound between words or the endings of words, especially when these are used at the ends of lines.

Alliteration: The occurrence of the same letter or sound at the beginning of adjacent or closely connected words.
