


1. There are three main ways to use colors in yearbooks.
 - a. Monochromatic uses different shades or tints of the same color.
 - b. Complimentary uses colors opposite of the color wheel.
 - c. Analogous uses colors next to each other on the color wheel.



2. Six suggestions for using color in your yearbook are:
 - a. Use color to draw attention-not a lot of color
 - b. Color creates a mood and compliment the spread
 - c. Know the mood you want-red vs blue
 - d. Consider your yearbook tome when selecting a color
 - e. Yellow is not irritable color but first color you recognize
 - f. Be careful of color as a background-hard to read

3. Three different styles of fonts are:

- a. Serif (they have feet on the bottom of their letters).
- b. Sans serif (they do not have feet on the bottom of their letters).
- c. Decorative (they are mainly used in headlines and appear as script or handwritten).



4. Five suggestions to know about fonts are:

- a. Fonts have a feeling-make sure you can read it
- b. Decorative fonts should be used for emphasis only
- c. When mixing font, use contrasts or opposite fonts
- d. Don't use too many fonts-only three to five in book
- e. Body font 9 to 10 pointl try it out to be sure



5. Three advantages of using infographics in your yearbook are:
