#### Writing

#### The ABCDs of Caption Writing

#### **OBJECTIVE**

MATERIALS NEEDED Students will be able to write accurate and informative captions for photos by identifying key details and applying proper caption structure and style.

- Laptops or tablets
- · Projector or whiteboard
- ABCDs of Caption Writing poster
- Examples of strong and weak captions
- · Student photos from the school year

### PART 1 INTRODUCTION (10 MINUTES)

Begin by discussing the ABCD structure using Walsworth's Caption Writing poster.

Then, display a series of photos - some with captions, and some without. Ask the class:

- What do you understand about this photo without a caption?
- How does a caption change the story or deepen the meaning?

**Introduce the concept:** Explain that captions are often the most-read text on a spread and are essential to telling the story behind a photo.

### PART 2 GUIDED PRACTICE (15 MINUTES)

Divide students into small teams.

- Provide 2-3 sample photos to the class.
- In teams, have students write captions using the ABCD method from the handout. For the purpose of this exercise, staffers can pull quotes from past captions or create their own.
- Volunteers will share their captions aloud. Discuss strengths and opportunities for improvement as a staff.

**Teacher Tip:** Reinforce key points during feedback. Are they using present tense in the first sentence? Did they include complementary information or a quote?

# PART 3 INDEPENDENT PRACTICE (25 MINUTES)

Direct each student to practice on their own for the assignment.

- Each staffer will select one new photo and write a complete caption using the ABCD method.
- Encourage students to include as much of the 5 Ws and H as possible and gather a short quote from someone pictured, if time allows.

Encourage students to write multiple captions for their photo to tell the best story of the photo.

## PART 4 WRAP UP & NEXT STEPS (10 MINUTES)

Each student will submit their caption for review.

- Provide students with feedback highlighting one strength and one growth area.
- Have students reflect by answering the prompt: "How does the ABCD method help you make captions more meaningful and professional?"

Encourage them to use the ABCDs of Caption Writing as a personal checklist for future assignments.
